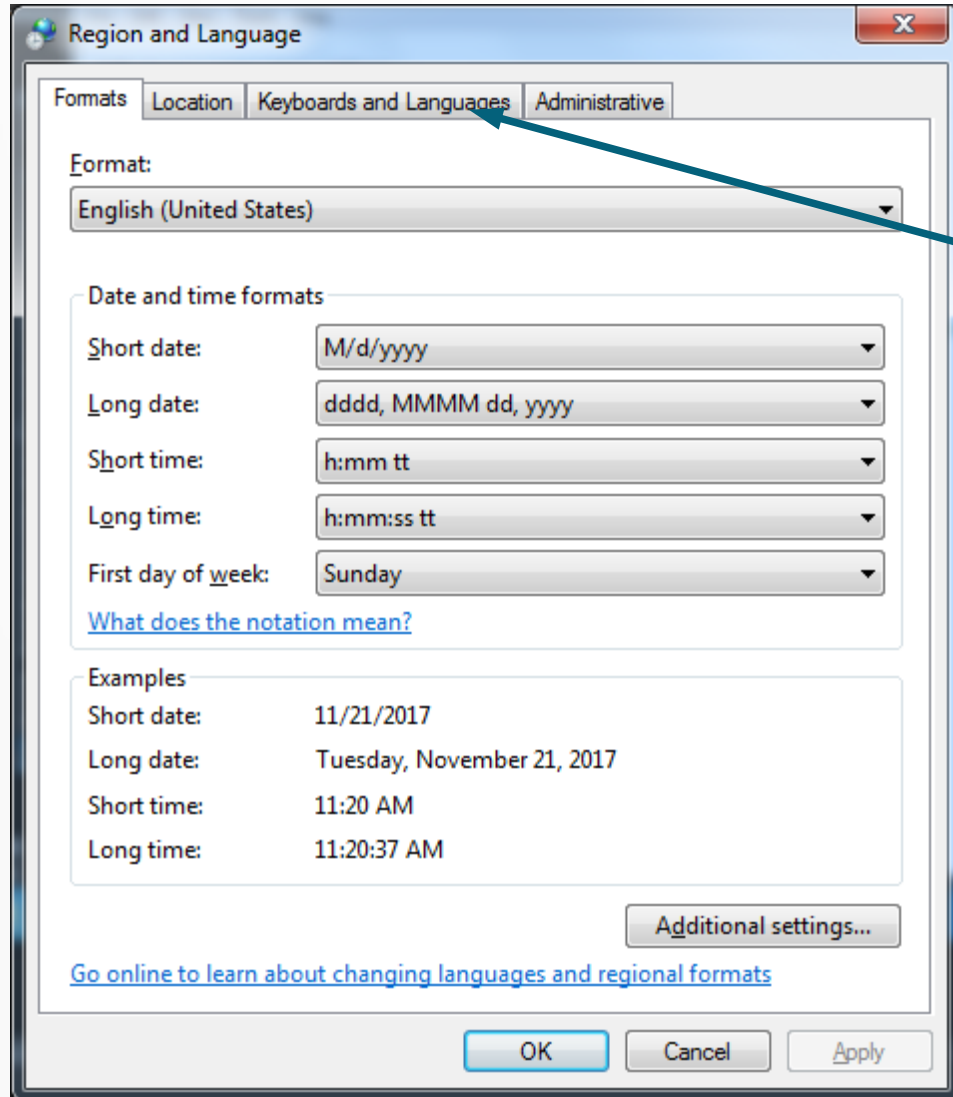

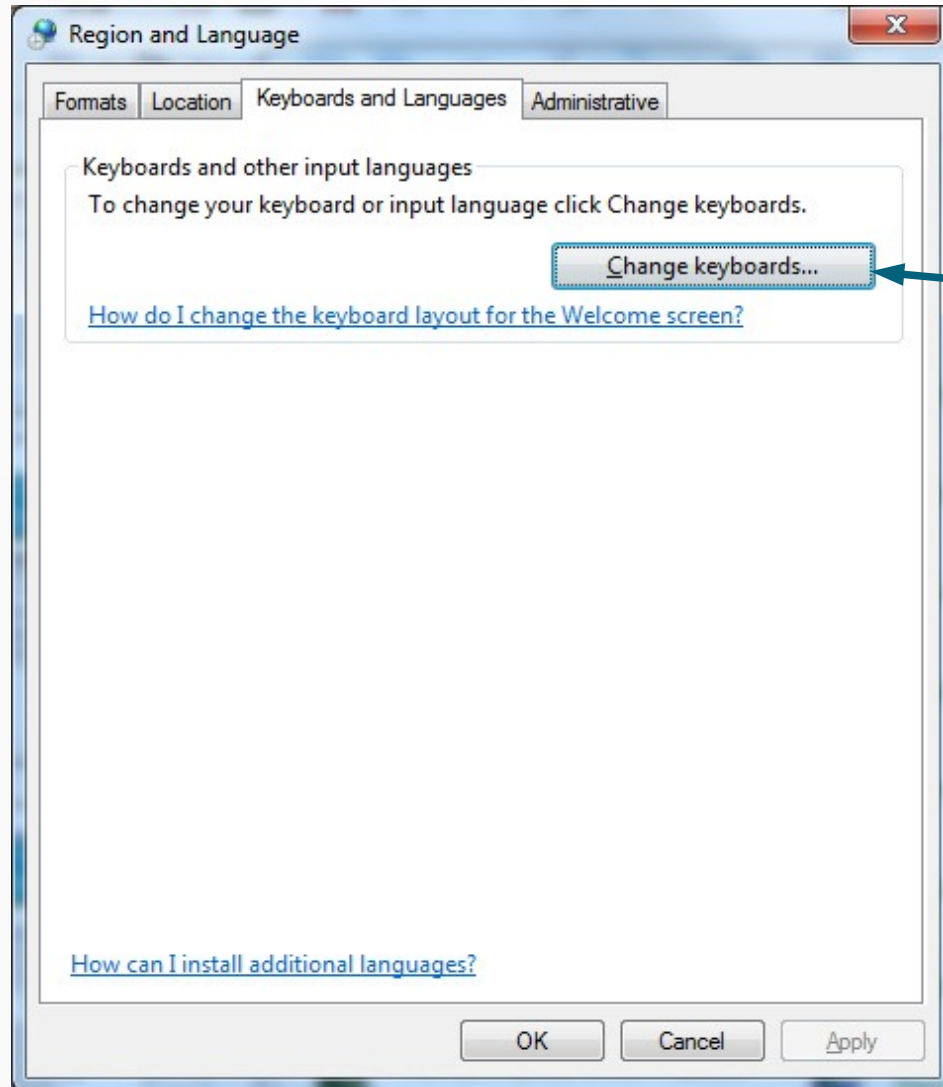

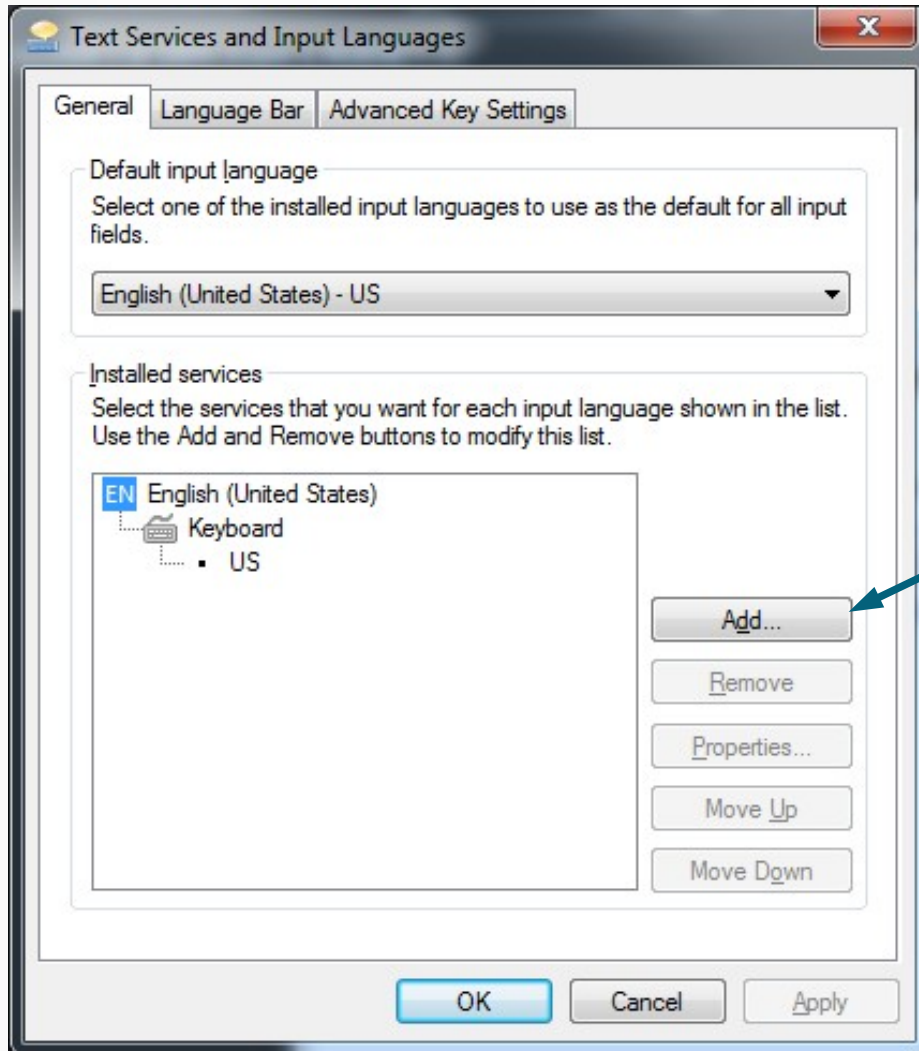
# Keyboard Setup - Step 3



Click on "Change keyboards..."



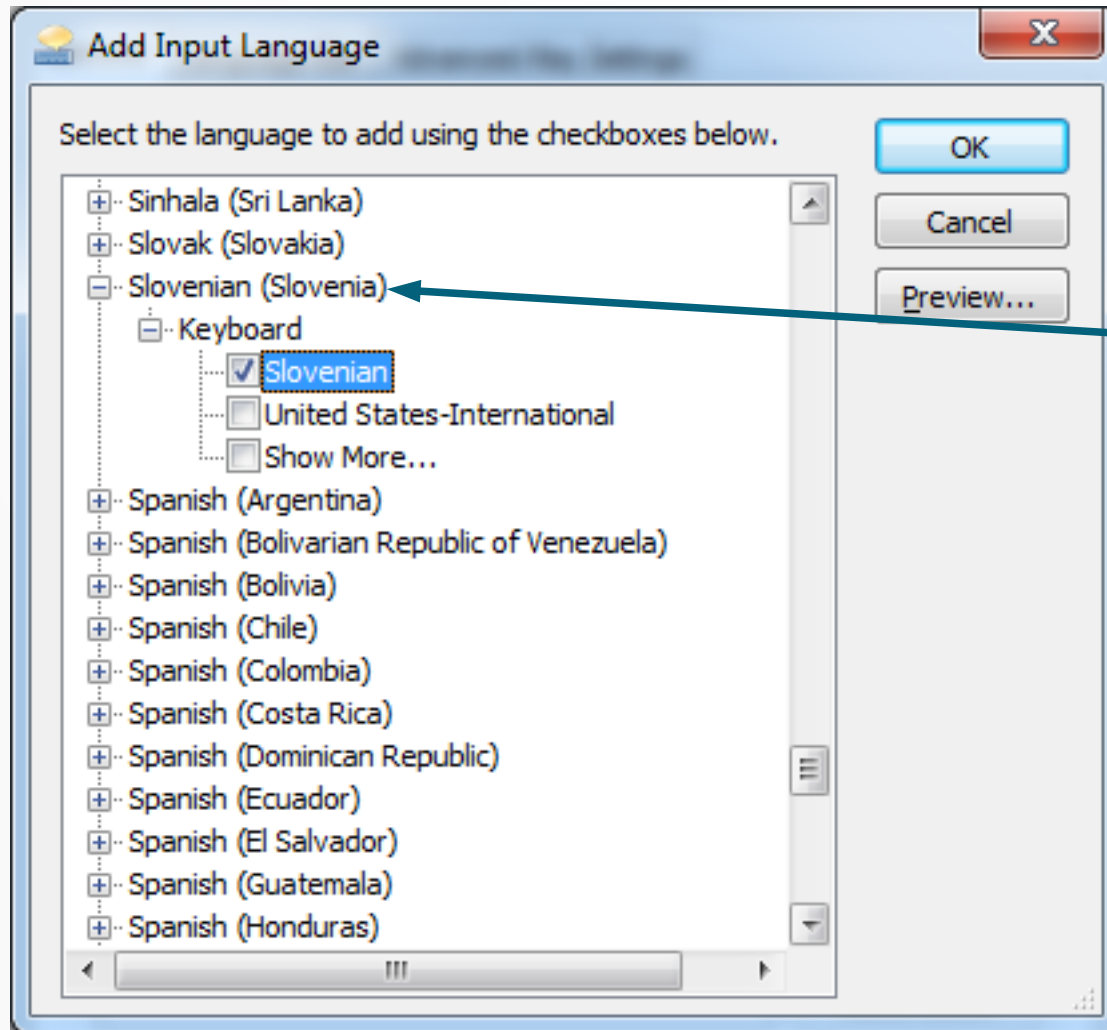
# Keyboard Setup - Step 4



Click on "Add"



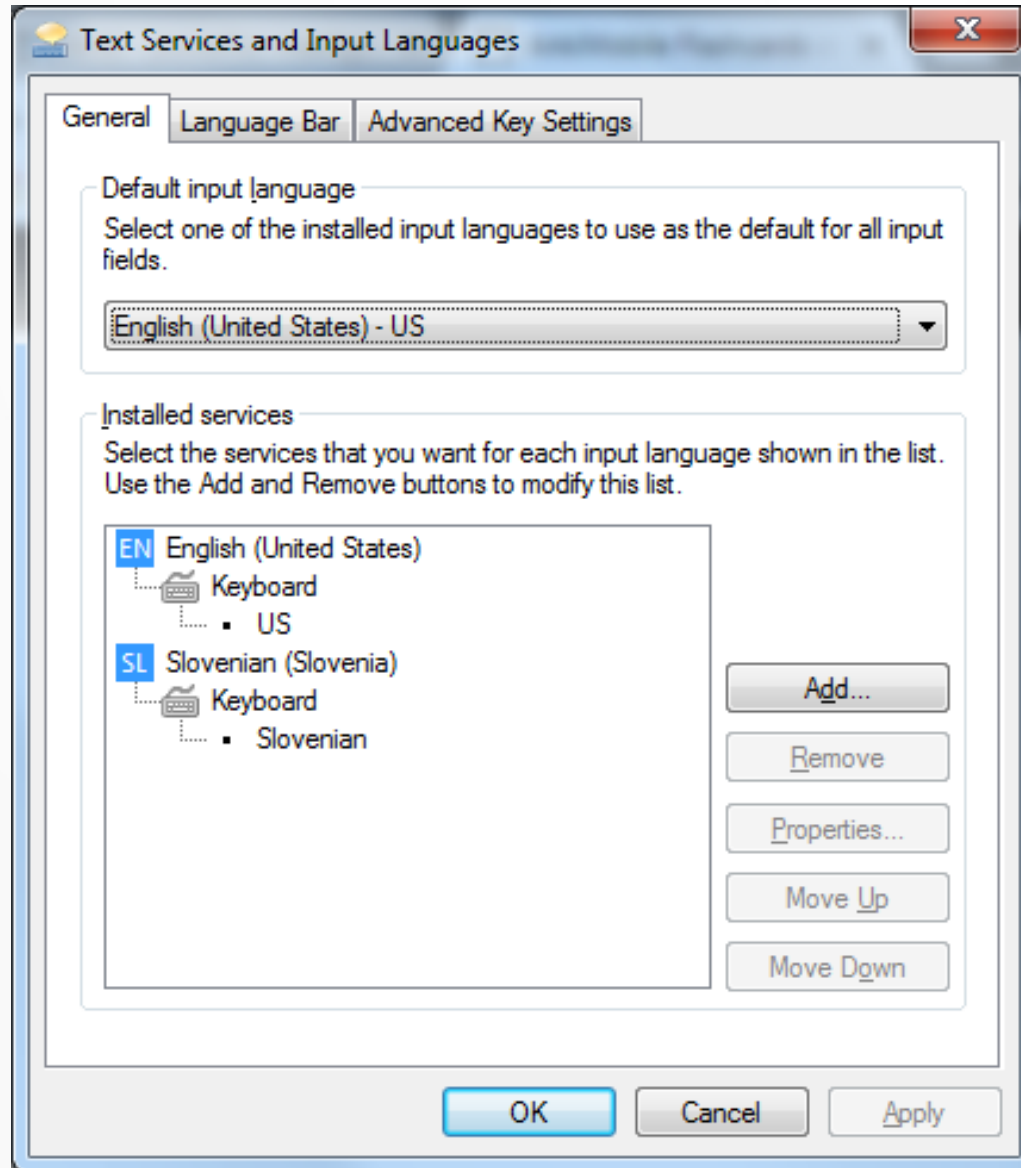
# Keyboard Setup - Step 5



Expand “Slovenian” to show “Keyboard” and its selection List.



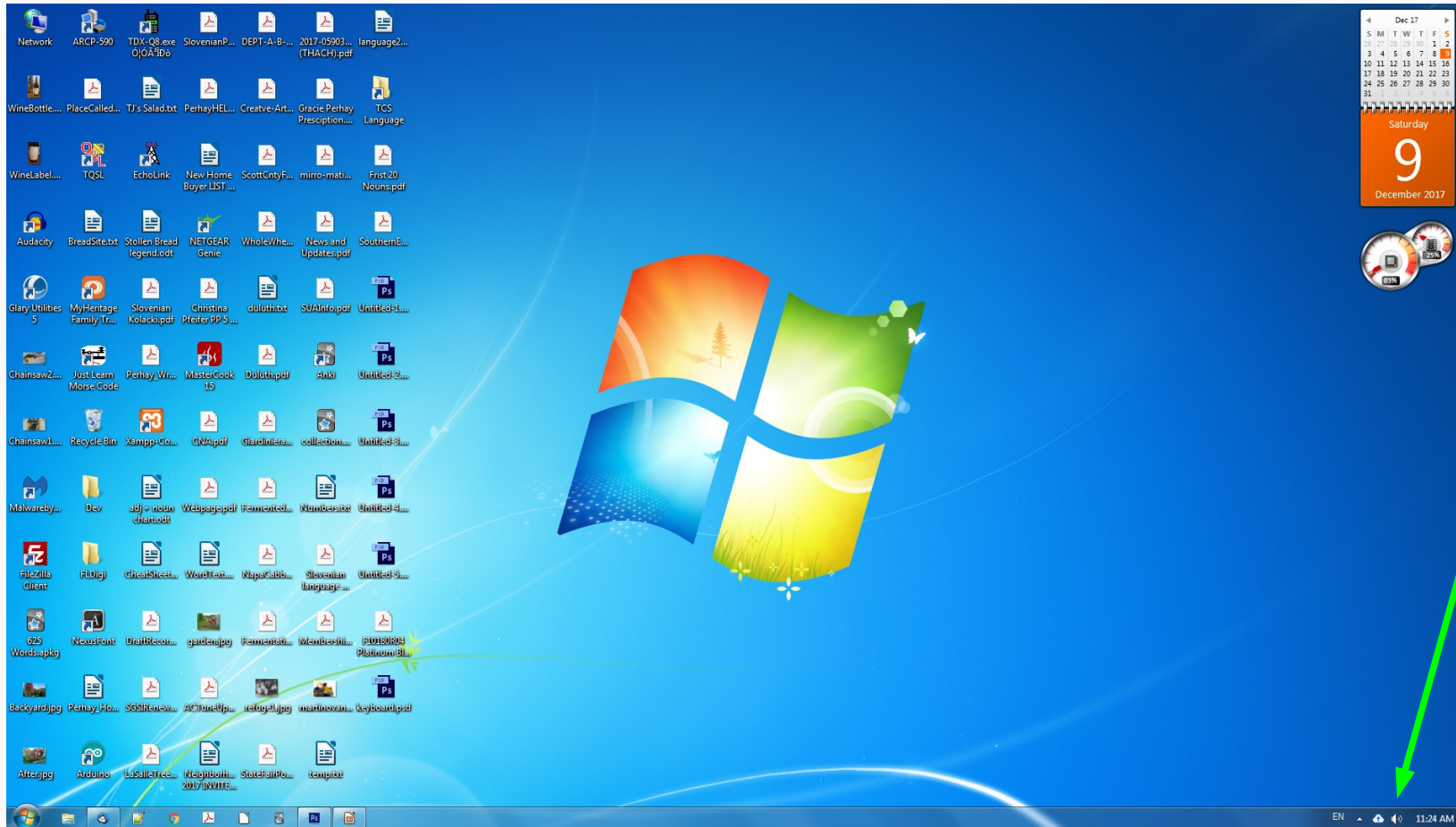

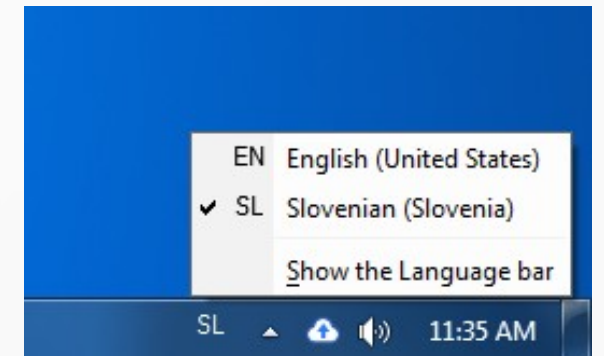
